
### **Sixth Form Leadership Team**

- Liaise with Maths faculty to record, track and review progress



- Work closely with careers team (Ms Shahmiri, Mr Scarth & Ms Fellows) – support with all things careers
- Work closely with Mental Health Lead (Ms Greene) to keep up to date with helping with mental health problems – training offered
- Strong understanding of UCAS and/or apprenticeship applications – be able to guide others through the process
- Being very organised, self driven & resilient towards your goals – be able to support others in doing the same
- Ability to model processes (i.e. revision timetables) and support the setting of SMART targets towards an end goal

#### How do I apply?/What next? Everyone has to apply for 1 role but can apply for two should they wish



- Complete the MS forms link I'd advise you write your application notes on paper or word first and have someone proof read this for you.
