

GCSE Geography

The subject content is divided into three units:

- 3.1: Living with the physical environment
- 3.2: Challenges in the human environment
- 3.3: Geographical applications including 2 opportunities for fieldwork.

You will study both human and physical geography throughout Year: 10 and 11, learning about key concepts and processes alongside examples and cases studies from the UK and wider world. Within the main two units of study,

you will be able to practice geographical skills, as well as applying your understanding to a geographical issue and two fieldwork investigations.
