
<u>Sixth Form Leadership Team – Supporting</u> <u>our school vision</u>












- Empathy understand that a lot of students find numeracy difficult and require different approaches to help them succeed.
- Liaise with Maths faculty to record, track and review progress

What skills do I need/ will I develop?


- Communication and interpersonal skills
